How to give regularly

You can give to St Paul's by a regular donation from your bank account using a Standing Order.

- You can set this up using the details below
- Donations are at the frequency you desire – weekly, monthly, quarterly or annually. Monthly is ideal for St Paul's to enable us to plan.
- If you are a UK taxpayer, please complete a [Gift Aid declaration](#) to enable St Paul's to claim back the tax that you have paid on this amount. It's at no cost to you. You'll find the Gift Aid declaration [here](#).
- Higher-rate taxpayers get further relief when they make donations via Gift Aid – declare the Gift Aid donations in your self-assessment return.
- St Paul's handles the Gift Aid claim
